Nigerians Received into ICCEC

Port Hacourt, located in Nigeria, which has the largest population in Africa, is the new home of a CEC parish.

On March 6 the Most Rev. Bernard Katili Matolo ordained Rev. Father Ibisio Igani as priest, as well as two deacons, Rev. Deacon Festus Osawe Uhunmwangho, and Rev. Deacon Gabriel Richard Adione. Mrs Grace Gabriel Adione and Mrs Ebimoboere Amiekumo Igani were commissioned as lay ministers.

According to Bishop Matolo, Father Igani had been preparing his church for reception into the Communion for quite some time after meetings with Bishop Phillip Weeks, missions consultant to the Patriarch.

“The church was very happy

about joining the CEC,” Bishop Matalo said. “I believe there is much potential for growth in Nigeria.”

Youth Summer Retreat in Deland, FL. – for those who have been in middle or high



Tres Arroyos in the Charismatic Episcopal Church
